### Biographies:

There are many biographies of persons whose lives are inspirational, exemplify virtues, and are exemplars of how to deal with inevitable life problems and crises. The following are suggested for the reasons stated:

Leonard Baker, *John Marshall, A Life In Law* (Macmillan 1974). This will give you a fundamental understanding of how our country was formed, how our tri-part system of Government works and an understanding of our foundational constitutional court decisions.

Robert Coles, M.D., *Dorothy Day: A Radical Devotion* (Radcliffe Biography Series) (Da Capo Press, 1987). Dorothy Day came to devote her life to helping the poor and the working class. She started the catholic Worker Movement which still exists today. She led a very atypical life. Robert Coles, M.D. is a Harvard Psychiatrist who has written some of the best books on children. Dorothy Day wrote several books, including an autobiography, *Long Loneliness* (Resources for Christian Living 1989 - Cloth, HarperOne 1996 - Paperback), her diaries - *The Duty of Delight. The Diaries of Dorothy Day* (Hardcover) by Robert Ellsberg (Editor) Marquette Univ Pr; First Edition edition (April 23, 2008). She wrote other books and magazine articles.

George Weigel, *Witness To Hope, Biography of John Paul II* (Harper Collins 1999) John Paul II's impact on the Catholic Church, catholic theology, and the world is extremely significant. He stands as a premier example of a faith lived life.

Karl Stern, *Pillar of Fire* (1951, Harcourt Brace 1951). Karl Stern was a German-Jewish Psychiatrist who survived a Nazi concentration camp.)

Vera Atkins, *A Life In Secrets* (Little Brown 2005). Patriotism - seems, as times, an undervalued virtue in Western countries today. This account concerns the fate of the women who volunteered to be spies for England during World War II. The wonderful film, *Charlotte Gray*, pales in comparison to the stories of these women, whose courage and fidelity is rare and truly extraordinary.
